Who can attend Rosie's Girls?

Girls entering 6th, 7th and 8th grade.

Can my child attend if she is entering 9th grade?

No. Experience has shown us that girls have the best experience when we limit the group to those entering 6th, 7th and 8th grades only.

Does my child need to attend all three weeks?

Yes. The program is designed as a three week experience and works best when campers attend the whole time.

How much does it cost?

Tuition for the three-week camp is \$725. Financial aid is available for qualified families.

Do I need to bring special tools or equipment?

No. Each girl will be supplied with basic hand tools to keep. If your child doesn't have work boots, we can lend her a pair for camp.

Why Rosie?

Rosie's Girls takes its name from Rosie the Riveter, the fictional World War II icon who represented the women who went to work in shipyards and factories to fill shortages while men fought overseas.

What Happens at Rosie's Girls
